Program: Hunting and Fishing in Central Wisconsin



Ericka Taylor, Conservation Warden with the State of Wisconsin, shared hunting and outdoor recreation trends in Central Wisconsin. Some of the highlights from her presentation were as follows:

- Waterfowl has decreased from 2017 to 2018 as the mallard's population declined by 12% along with the blue-winged teal declined by 18%. The American wigeon was one of the waterfowl that increased in the survey presented.
- Black bear population in Wisconsin is estimated around 28,700. In order to help control the bear population the state issues harvest permits. The harvest permits issued for bear hunting in Wisconsin were 12,970 in 2018. The bears harvested in 2017 were 4,159 and the harvest goal for 2018 is 4,550.
- Turkeys harvested in 2018 were 38,886, which is down from the 2017 harvest of 43,305. The decline in the turkeys harvested in 2018 was most likely due to the late winter, which affected the spring harvest.
- Outdoor recreation in Wisconsin provides a lot of options for the outdoor enthusiast. With the abundance of water available in the state there are many activities do such as fishing, boating, and swimming. There are also many parks and trails that are used for camping, hiking, biking, snowshoeing, and skiing.

Overall, the trends for both hunting and outdoor recreation in Wisconsin continue to increase.
