Jim Shewchuck introduced Jackie Esselman and Dr. Mandy Lang, the Mid-State Technical College's Vice President of Student Services and Enrollment. During the presentation, they covered the K12 relations, admissions and enrollment, financial aid and counseling, advising, and other student support services. Some of the highlights of their presentation were as follows:

- 1 of 4 Mid-State Pillars
- Need to serve to meet declining enrollment, workforce and skills gap, and high schools asking for help.
- Regional economic data: Lose 49,000 workers in the next five years, declining birth rate and loss of 3,528 students.
- Large number of in-demand careers.
- Offering dual credits giving opportunity to take college courses to earn both college credits and high school credits, which saves time and money.
- In 2016/17 800 high school students took at least one college course and in 2017/18 1400 students took at least one college course.
