



Rotary Memories

Rotary Memories: Week of December 17, 2018

In an effort to highlight "100 years of Service," this column will occasionally be used to recognize the accomplishments of our Rotary Club and our Fellow Rotarians over the past 100 years. This past Monday, we had an opportunity to learn about something new from Solarus.

Only 20 years after Alexander Graham Bell's 1876 invention of the telephone, the Wood County Telephone Company was founded. Centralia and Grand Rapids received their first telephones in 1878. The first long-distance toll line consisted of a single No. 9 wire, connected in 1887 from the switchboard of the Wisconsin Telephone Co. at Stevens Point to a single phone in Grand Rapids.

Early telephone service was provided by the Bell Co. and it offered very poor service for a very expensive price. The rates were \$4.00 per month for businesses and \$3.00 per month for residences. A group of local businessmen began to look for an alternative. The competition for local telephone service became brutal. The Bell Co. began to offer their subscribers three years' of free service in order to put any competition out of business. Thanks to an effort by local businessmen along with the support of the Centralia Enterprise and the Grand Rapids Tribune, phone service was provided at \$2.00 per month for businesses and \$1.50 per month for residences.

The Twin Cities of Centralia and Grand Rapids embraced this new company and on June 1, 1896 the Wood County Telephone Company was established and it has been going strong ever since offering state of the art communications to our area for almost 125 years.
