Attorney Dana Duncan from Duncan Disability Law, S.C. presented a program to the Club on Social Security Disability. Duncan Disability Law S.C. is a family owned business since 2011 and Attorney Duncan has over 26 years of experience. Over the past several years the company has grown from three staff members to now twenty-five staff. The company wants to help make the Social Security Disability process simple for its clients and will provide step by step guidance to them. The beginning process for Social Security Disability first starts with the application process, which only approximately 30% of the applications who apply are approved to receive the benefits. If the applicant is unsuccessful in receiving the benefits there are additional processes that can be done, such as: Reconsideration, Hearing, Appeals Council, Federal District Court, U.S. Court of Appeals, and the Supreme Court. For many individuals, it can take several years before they are able to finally receive benefits, if at all, which can cause many financial hardships along the way for them.

## Rotary Memories: Week of November 27, 2017

### 10 Years Ago .....

Bill Quinn introduced Mike O’Leary who talked about what’s new with Orthodontics. Conventional orthodontic treatment involves the placement of braces on a person’s teeth and an arch wire which is positioned in a slot in the braces and applies the necessary forces to generate tooth movement. Diagnosis and treatment planning are accomplished utilizing plaster dental models and 2-D x-rays. Fine tuning arch wire bends are made manually to a stainless steel wire to make adjustments toward the final tooth alignment. Typical treatment requires approximately two years to complete.

A new technology driven orthodontic process called “SureSmile” offers several important benefits that make the “braces experience” much easier for patients. It utilizes sophisticated 3-D imaging, computerized treatment planning, and robotically bent memory alloy arch wires to obtain excellent results with fewer office visits, less overall discomfort, and shorter treatment times. The teeth and braces are scanned to build a computer 3-D model using “SureSmile” 3-D treatment planning software. Precise tooth movements are determined from the virtual model. This information is sent electronically to a digital lab where shape memory alloy arch wires are bent by “SureSmile” robots. This creates more direct tooth movement and shorter treatment times.
