Rotary Memories: Week of May 14, 2018

25 Years Ago

Henry Bennett introduced Ken Knapp of Power and Energy at Consolidated Papers, Inc. (CPI), who presented "Energy in Flux." The energy source that has changed the most in the last ten years is natural gas. The industry went from heavy regulation and high prices to deregulation and costs that were half as much as before. Pipelines currently bring a portion of our gas supply from Oklahoma and Louisiana. We currently have a 36-year proven reserve. On the other hand, electricity has a current base load of 9 to 10 years. However, Wisconsin does need more Peakers to provide additional service during heavy usage. CPI currently uses 2% of the energy consumption of the entire state. 48% of this is renewable power. However, their energy usage per ton is 11% below the state average with Ken Knapp citing the Paperboard Products Division as the best example. On the average, 60% of his day is spent dealing with regulatory issues with 40% going to other functions.
