This week's program was on the Rotary International's World Peace Scholar's. Our Wisconsin Rapids Noon Rotary Club had the honor of past Rotary International Director Jerry Meigs and Rotary International Major Gifts Officer Rachel Greenhoe, as the program speakers.

Annually, the Rotary Foundation selects up to 100 professionals from around the world to receive fellowships to study at one of the Peace Centers. Through academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities, the Rotary Peace Centers program develops leaders who become catalysts for peace and conflict prevention and resolution. These fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses. Since 2002, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained 1,100 fellows for careers in peacebuilding. Many of them are serving as leaders at international organizations or have started their own foundations.

Every year, the Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and 50 for certificate studies at premier universities around the world.

- Master's degree programs: Last 15 to 24 months and require a practical internship of two to three months during the academic break.
- Professional development certificate program: For experienced professionals and lasts three months with two to three weeks of field study.

25 Years Ago

Pat Brennan presented his own program on the progress made by the US paper industry with recycled paper products. To date, the US paper industry has been successful in diverting paper and paperboard products from the waste stream to be used for recycling. Over 60% of the landfill waste has been recovered. In 1993, landfill recovery exceeded 30 million tons.

Recycled paper has a hierarchy of uses from high quality enameled papers to toilet paper. Consolidated's own Ventura line is an example of recycled papers used in high-quality enameled paper. The use of recycled paper is expected to increase in the future as communities increase their efforts to collect. The paper industry has extensive reforestation programs that have increased our countries forest acreage. Saving the landfill is the primary purpose for recycling.
